II. The Parables of the Kingdom of God

•Several parables begin with "The kingdom of heaven/God is like ..." (Mt 13). These parables illustrate the amazing power of the KG to grow and its incredible value to grasp and are intended to encourage the audience to accept the KG.

oGrowing seed (Mk 4:26-29) oMustard seed (Mk 4:30-32; Mt 13:31-32; Lk 13:18-19) oWeeds among wheat (Mt 13:24-30), oYeast (Mt 13:33; Lk 13:20-21) oHidden treasure and valuable pearl (Mt 13:44-46) oFishing net (Mt 13:47-50) oHouse owner (Mt 13:52) oUnmerciful servant (Mt 18:23-31)

1. What is the "Kingdom of God"?

- •Jesus' central message: "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent and believe in the good news." (Mk 1:15).
- •KG/KH appears 110x in the NT mostly in the Synoptic Gospels.
- Βασιλεία θεοῦ (*kingdom of God*) means God is the king of kings, the almighty one who reigns and protects God's people in a realm.
- •In times of democracy, theologians replace the "kingdom of God" with the "reign of God."

2. What does the Kingdom of God mean?

•Two questions:

oJesus never defined what the KG meant and simply assumed his Jewish audience knew what he was referring to.

oThe phrase KG never appears in the OT.

•B. Chilton's research shows the phrase "Kingdom of God" in Aramaic (Jesus' language) מלכותא (malkutha-deloha) occurs in Isaiah Targum (Aramaic translation of the Hebrew Isaiah) many times, as a pious circumlocution to avoid direct naming of God, to paraphrase the idea of God's self-revelation in the end times, which reflects the Zion theology expecting God to return to the Holy Mountain in Zion, to rescue God's people from all evil with mighty power and to make all peoples recognize God's justice in great glory. (Bruce Chilton, The Glory of Israel: The Theology and Providence of the Isiah Targum, pp. 77-81).

 Targum 	so the kingdom of the Lord of hosts will be revealed to dwell on

Mount Zion.

- •MT Heb behold your God.
- •Targum the kingdom of your God is revealed.

- •Will self-reveal and intervene in human history
- •To defeat the evil that terrifies God's people and
- •To rescue the suffering people with mighty power,
- •That all peoples may recognize God's faithfulness and glory.
